- However, the high cost of living and limited housing options, due to the dense population, can be challenging.





- Parramatta is located approximately 24 kilometres (15 mi) west of the Sydney CBD, on the banks of the Parramatta River
- The largest ethnic groups: Chinese (22.3%), English (14.4%), Australian (13.9%), Indian (11.2%), Korean (5.9%).
- Parramatta is a major transportation hub with various options: trains, buses, and ferries, light rail.
- Parramatta provides the convenience of excellent services, abundant opportunities, and vibrant entertainment options, but it also comes with a high cost of living comparable to Sydney CBD.



- Liverpool, NSW, has good transportation options with buses, trains connect to Sydney, major roads like the M5 and M7 offer easy car access.

Penrith

Gateway to the Blue Mountains

- It is well-served by the Penrith Railway Station, which offers regular train services to Sydney's CBD (taking about 50-60 mins), bus services and M4 Motorway that connect Penrith with surrounding areas.
- The Penrith Panthers entertainment precinct and numerous local events offer diverse options, from local cafes to major shopping centres.
- Penrith serves as a gateway to the
 Blue Mountains, providing easy
 access via road and rail for those
 travelling to the region's iconic natural
 attractions.
